THE PREPARATION

O Lord, open our lips **AND OUR MOUTH SHALL PROCLAIM YOUR PRAISE.**

Blessèd are you, Sovereign God, King of the nations, to you be praise and glory for ever! [From the rising of the sun to its setting your name is proclaimed in all the world.] As the Sun of Righteousness dawns in our hearts, anoint our lips with the seal of your Spirit that we may witness to your gospel and sing your praise in all the world, Father, Son and Holy Spirit: **BLESSÈD BE GOD FOR EVER!**

God calls us to love one another: **O COME, LET US WORSHIP.**

Or, in Epiphanytide:

God in Christ has revealed his glory: **O COME, LET US WORSHIP.**

THE OPENING CANTICLE: A SONG OF GOD'S BLESSING

- May God be merciful to us and bless us,* show us the light of his countenance and come to us.
- 2 Let your ways be known upon earth,* your saving health among all nations.
- 3 Let the peoples praise you, O God;* let all the peoples praise you.
- 4 Let the nations be glad and sing for joy,* for you judge the peoples with equity and guide all the nations upon earth.
- 5 Let the peoples praise you, O God;* let all the peoples praise you.
- 6 The earth has brought forth her increase;* may God, our own God, give us his blessing.

9	In the tender compassion of our God,* the dawn from on high shall break upon us,
10	To shine on those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death,* and to guide our feet into the way of peace.

Let us pray for the unity of all peoples on earth, in the words our Saviour has taught us:

OUR FATHER, WHO ART IN HEAVEN, HALLOWED BE THY NAME; THY KINGDOM COME; THY WILL BE DONE; ON EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN. GIVE US THIS DAY OUR DAILY BREAD. AND FORGIVE US OUR TRESPASSES, AS WE FORGIVE THOSE WHO TRESPASS AGAINST US. AND LEAD US NOT INTO TEMPTATION; BUT DELIVER US FROM EVIL. FOR THINE IS THE KINGDOM, THE POWER, AND THE GLORY, FOR EVER AND EVER. AMEN.
